

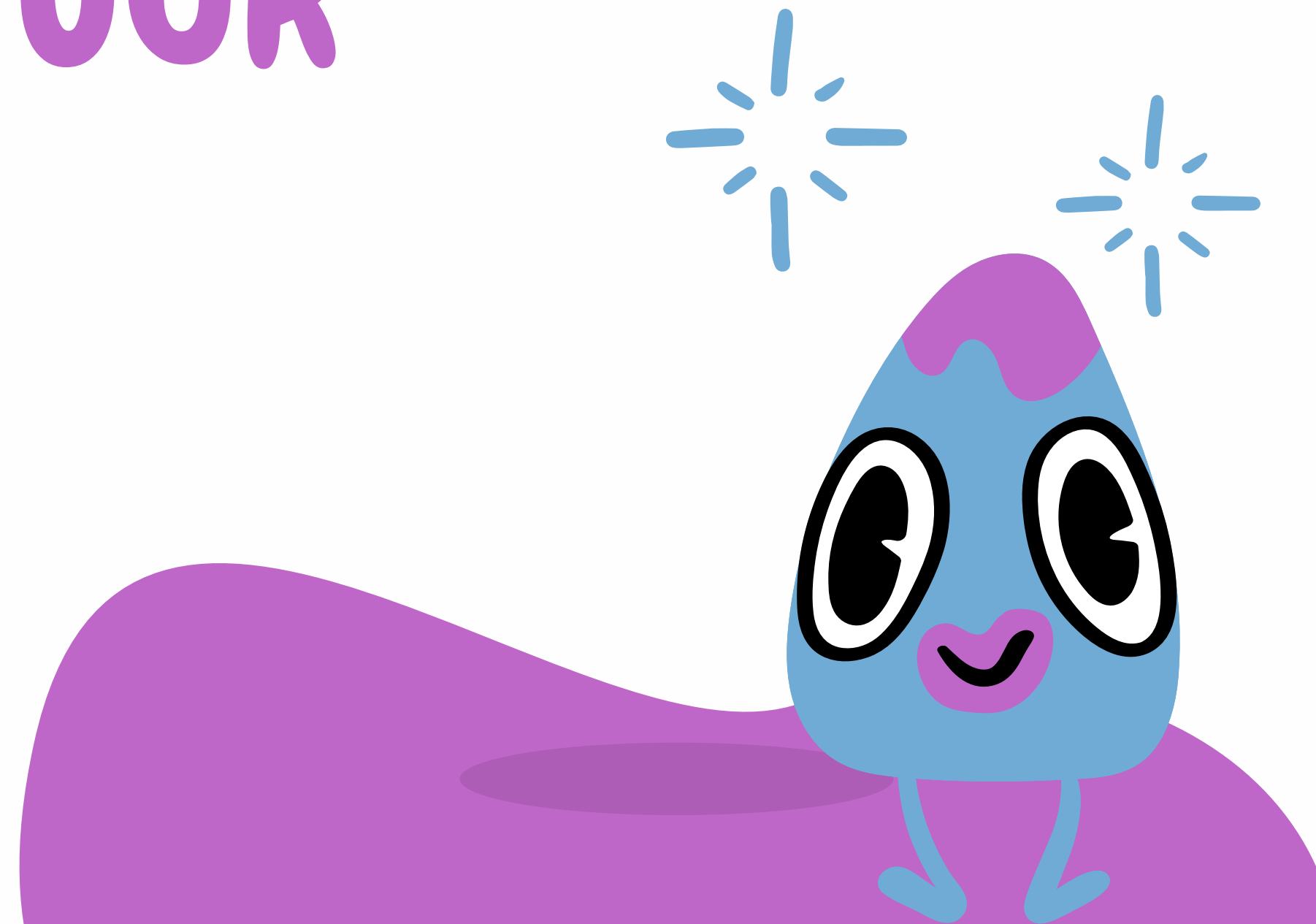

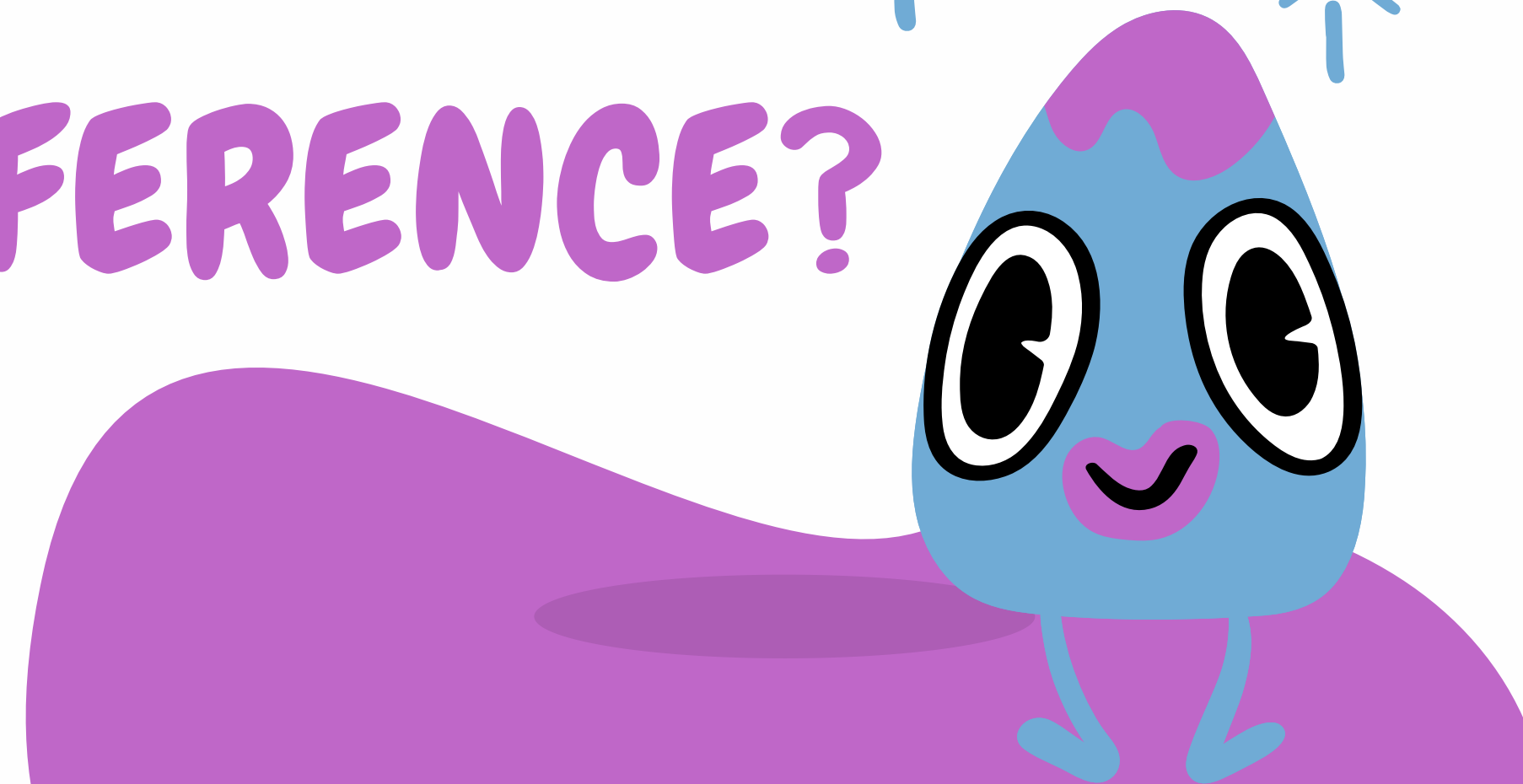

KEY TERMS

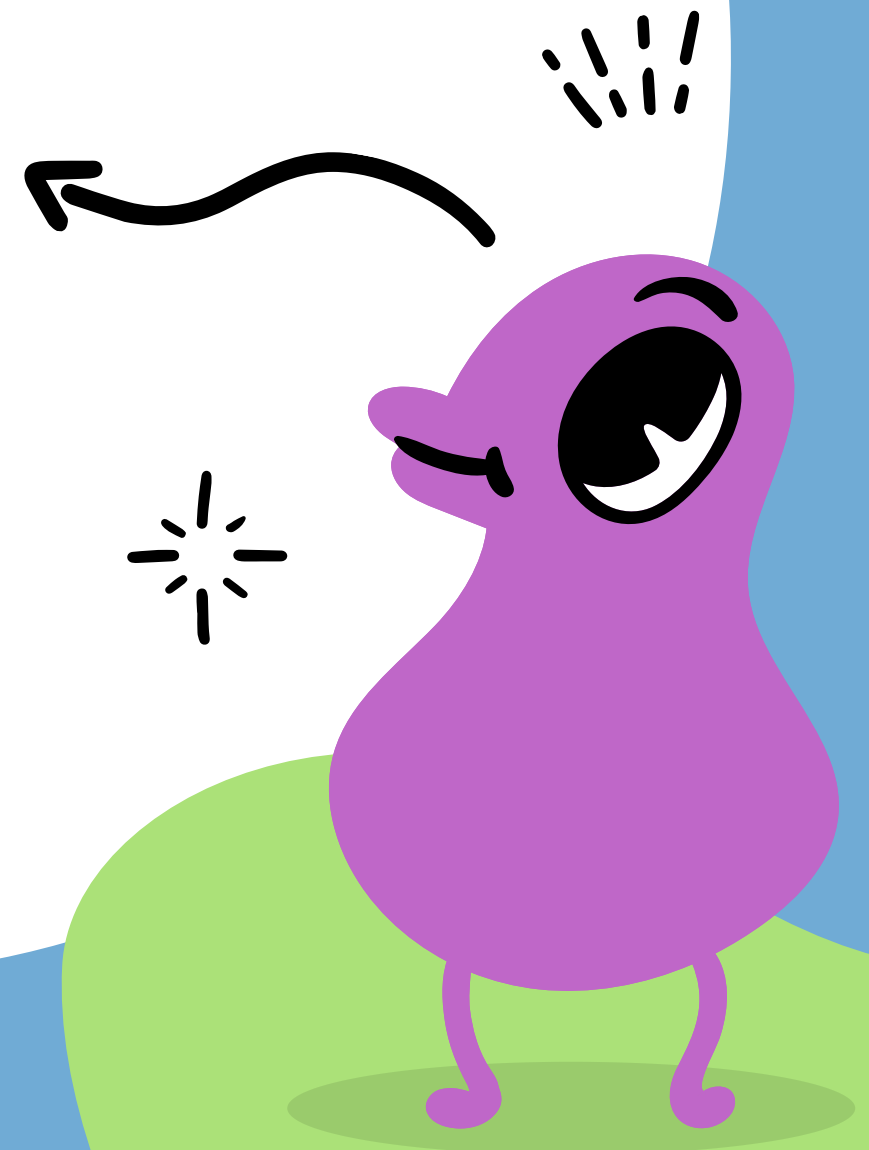
- **Gender identity** is a person's deeply held sense of their gender which is not visible to others
- **Sex** is assigned at birth
- **Trans** is an umbrella term for people whose gender identity and/or gender expression differs from the sex they were assigned at birth
- **Non-binary** is a term used by those who identify outside of the binary concept of man or woman
- **Cisgender** is a person whose gender is the same, or mostly the same as the one they were assigned at birth



What is a pronoun?

Words we use to refer to people's gender in conversation. E.g. she/ he/ they (to name but a few).

Top tip! Normalise asking people what their pronouns are, you could add yours to your bios on social media and in email signatures



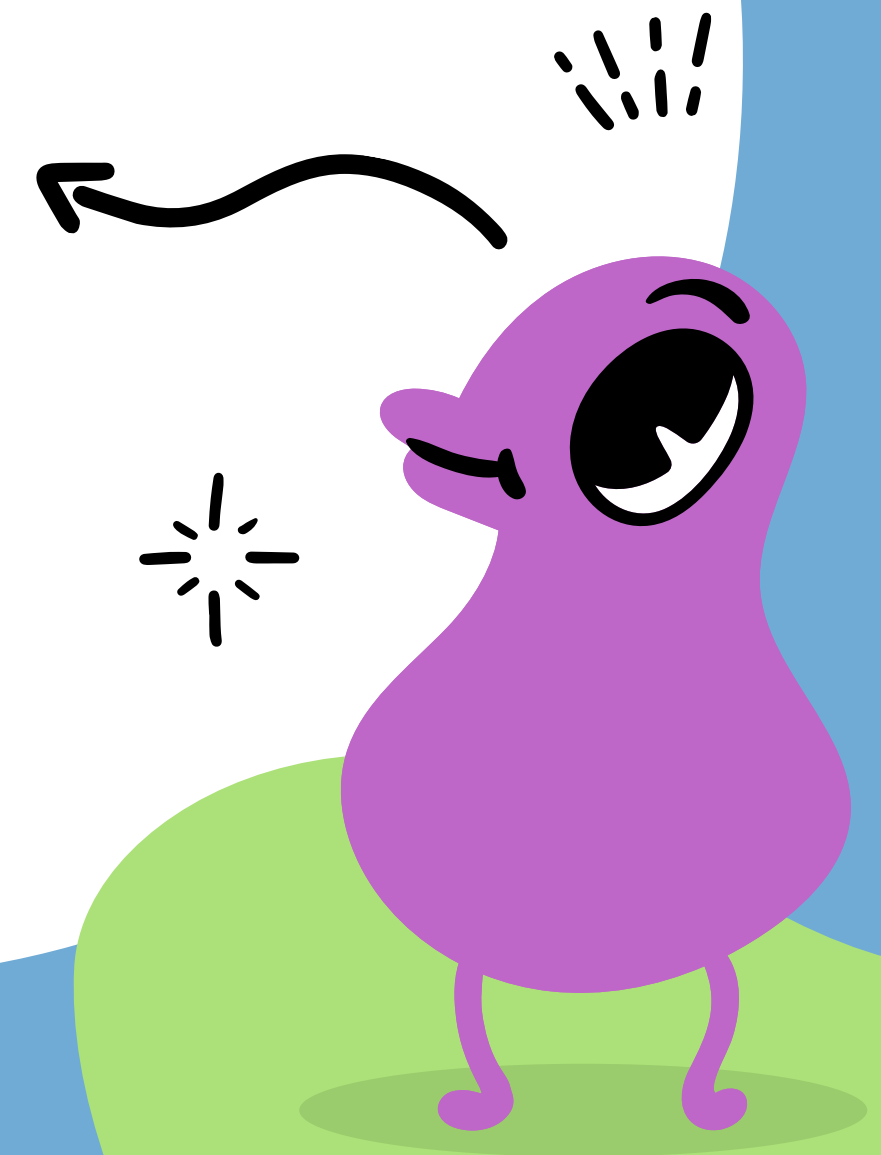
Key statistics...

- 64% of trans pupils are bullied in school
- More than four in five trans young people have self-harmed
- More than two in five trans young people have attempted to take their own life
- Two in five trans people (40 per cent) adjust the way they dress because they fear discrimination or harassment
- Two in five trans people (41 per cent) and three in ten non-binary people (31 per cent) have experienced a hate crime or incident because of their gender identity in the last 12 months
